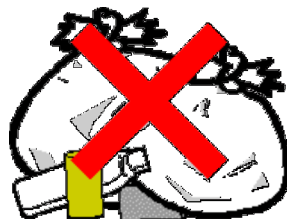

Unacceptable HHW Materials



Propane cylinders (recycle at the landfill)
Empty containers go in the garbage
Materials in containers larger than 5 gallons
Ammunition or explosives
Asbestos*
Radioactive materials
Fire Extinguisher
Latex Paint

Proper Disposal of Latex Paint

- Give away unused latex paint to a friend or a non-profit group (ex. housing project, school, or church group).
- Mix light colors together to use as a primer.
- Completely dried and hardened latex paint can be placed in your regular trash. Leave the lids off.
- Small quantities of latex paint can be dried by removing the lid and allowing the paint to dry. Keep it in a well ventilated area.
- Large quantities of latex paint can be poured in layers in a cardboard box/lid lined with plastic or newspaper. Or stir kitty litter or saw dust into the latex paint. Once the paint is fully absorbed and hardened it may be placed in the trash with the lid off.

ITEMS & FEES

Basic Charge: \$55.00 per ton
(\$10.00 minimum for 360 lbs. prorated up to 1 ton)
-TVs from your home are garbage and weighed with garbage.
-Take computer equipment to Goodwill or a computer store for recycling.

Put items listed below at the back of your load.

These items are dropped off at the Landfill Recycling Area before your load is weighed.

Used Motor Oil No Charge
Bring in 5 gallon or less containers
Dump oil into the landfill barrel

Lead Acid Batteries No Charge

Scrap Iron No Charge

Examples: angle iron, bed frames, bicycles, lawn mowers, lawn chairs, and other metal objects except no nails or bolts

Appliances \$10.00 each

Examples: refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, stoves, washing machines, dryers, hot water heaters, microwaves, dehumidifiers, air conditioners, furnaces, fluorescents light fixtures (without the bulbs).

Propane Cylinders \$6.00

We do not accept tanks with Freon, helium, acetylene and the real small propane tanks.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

The landfill **does not** accept any free liquids, dead animals, hazardous waste, whole car bodies or whole barrels.

COMPOSTING

The landfill **does not accept** any trees, branches, leaves or yard and garden waste for disposal. These items may go to the City of Marshalltown Compost Facility at 900 Woodland Street. The phone number is 754-5745 (at the facility). If no answer call 754-5734.

RECYCLE ITEMS BANNED

The landfill **does not accept** any of the following recyclable materials:

—Cardboard	— Newspaper & inserts
—Magazines	— #1 & #2 Plastics
—Tin cans	— Clear glass bottles and jars
—Office paper	
—Junk mail	

Recycle these items through your hauler, or use a processor of your choice. (see list)

HOW TO RECYCLE

Glass:

- Remove lids and any rings, put in the garbage
- Rinse clean with water or dishwater
- Labels do not need to be removed
- Broken items go in the garbage
- Only recycle glass that was used for food or beverage containers are recycled
- Do not recycle drinking glasses, light bulbs, window glass, mirror glass, Pyrex, crystal, colored, and tinted glass.

Tin Cans

- Clean and remove labels, flatten if possible
- Aerosol cans if empty go in the garbage or see HHW list.
- Return aluminum cans for a deposit. Return to the redemption center.

#1 & #2 Plastics

- Look for #1 or #2 on the container (usually on the bottom)
- Clean. Remove lids. Throw in the garbage
- Flatten when possible to conserve space
- Any empty #1 & #2 plastics from cooking oil, motor oil, antifreeze, or a hazardous material should be placed in the garbage
- All other numbers of plastics go in the garbage

Paper Products

- Sack newspapers (and anything that comes with the newspaper) in a clean grocery or plastic bag
- All other paper, junk mail, magazines, etc., should go into a separate bag
- Corrugated cardboard and paperboard boxes like cereal boxes and shoe boxes can be recycled.
- If it is rainy, please double bag all paper items.
- Any wax coated or soiled paper and cardboard should be put in the garbage Ex. Pizza boxes

Charges for recycling and solid waste are available by contacting the drop-off site or haulers.
